8 Gold Medals (1928–1980), 1 Silver (1960), and 3 Bronze (1968, 1972, 2020).

BENEFITS FOR INDIAN OLYMPIC MEDALISTS: FUELING FUTURE CHAMPIONS

India's Olympic medal winners do not just go back home to accolades but come back home with lifetime support and accolades. Decades of working together with private organizations, the government has designed a structured system to honor the years of toil of these medallists. The support extended to the medallists has changed the sporting culture in India- sports and career choices for students. Here is a look at the supports available for Olympic Medal winners:

1. CASH PRIZES: REWARD SUCCESS WITH CASH BONUSES

Cash prizes to Indian Olympic medal winners are given by the Centre and states through cash awards as are:

Cash awards by Centre

Gold: Rs 75 lakh

Silver: Rs 40 lakh

Bronze: Rs 25 lakh.

State Governments top these prizes; for example, Haryana offers INR 6 crore to a Gold medal winner, INR 4 crore to a Silver medal winner, and INR 2.5 crore to a Bronze medal winner. Similarly, the treasury prizes received in the states of Punjab, Maharashtra, and Odisha go as tall figures.

2. JOBS IN GOVERNMENT: GUARANTEED CAREERS FOR THE MEDAL WINNERS

Many states offer well-known government positions to medalists. Such a location gives the athletes stable post-sports careers. Positions in the police department, administrative services, and other respected departments are provided to the medalists. The mentioned position will provide the medalist with security he or she needs and enable him or her to impact sports policy within the government.

3. RESIDENTIAL PLOTS AND HOUSING: HOME

Residential plots or apartments in prime locations are usually given to medal winners to reward their performances. This gesture of the state governments rewards the athletes while at the same time providing them and their families with priceless assets in the future.

4. MONTHLY PENSION AND STIPENDS: SUPPORT THE CHAMPIONS

The central government and the state governments offer monthly pensions or stipends to retired Olympic athletes. Pensions ensure financial stability for an athlete after retirement, giving time to turn energies to mentoring or other productive ventures.

5. AVAILABILITY OF WORLD-CLASS TRAINING FACILITIES

For those athletes who would want to go on and continue competing, medals open up to them special training facilities they otherwise may not be allowed to use. IN THE "RAREST OF RARE" CRIMES IN BHUBANESWAR, A MAN IS EXECUTED FOR STABBING HIS WIFE 33 TIMES.



A man who viciously killed his wife on June 9, 2022, in Ghatikia, inside the boundaries of the Khandagiri Police in Bhubaneswar, was sentenced to death by the Additional District Judge (ADJ) on Thursday.

The convicted criminal who carried out the horrible act was Sanjit Das.

In order to set an example for society, the court described the savage murder case as the "rarest of rare" crimes as it handed down its ruling.

It was a horrible offense. Sanjit Das, who was convicted, stabbed his wife 33 times with a knife over a pointless spat. He even cut his daughter Pari's throat at age six in order to eliminate evidence. A spouse is typically viewed as his wife's and daughter's savior. Nevertheless, the prisoner brutally killed his wife. The crime was taken into consideration by the court.

"A life sentence is imposed when the court determines that the heinousness of the offense in all its parts is too great to persuade the convicted person to change his ways. Therefore, the court sentenced the defendant to death, deeming the case a "rarest of rare" crime. Up to fifteen witnesses' statements, including those of the convict's daughter and family members, were taken into account while determining the sentencing. In addition, forensic evidence and specialists were taken into account when determining the penalty," he continued.

ODISHA IS STILL EXPERIENCING A POTATO CRISIS, WITH PRICES RISING BY MUCH THAN RS 50 PER KG.



Prices for potatoes have skyrocketed as a result of them nearly disappearing from certain Odisha marketplaces. Customers' wallets are being squeezed as the necessary kitchen item is now priced between Rs 50 and Rs 60 per kg.

Due to a shortage of potatoes and their excessive pricing throughout the state, consumers in Odisha are still dealing with a problem. Although the West Bengal Police are pursuing and apprehending the trucks carrying potatoes that are on their way to Odisha, the state's needs cannot be met by the procurement from Uttar Pradesh alone. The State's average citizen's budget has been negatively impacted by the rapidly rising costs of basic kitchen necessities.

Prices for potatoes have skyrocketed as a result of them nearly disappearing from certain Odisha marketplaces. Customers' wallets are being squeezed as the necessary kitchen item is now priced between Rs 50 and Rs 60 per kg.

"The market does not carry potatoes. We have to pay between Rs 50 and Rs 60 for a kilogram of potatoes," Minaketana Swain, a Niali customer, stated.

The market does not have a sufficient supply of potatoes. As a result, the price has increased dramatically," stated Balasore shopkeeper Dharanidhar Sahoo.

A few days ago, some trucks loaded with potatoes from nearby West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh arrived in Odisha, sparking rumors that the state's issue would be resolved. But within the past three days, the necessary product has all but disappeared from the market.

According to sources, it is taking nearly four days for potatoes from Uttar Pradesh to arrive, and during that time, a significant amount of the necessary commodity is being lost.

Additionally, vehicles carrying potatoes are being pursued and seized by West Bengal Police as they travel to Odisha. West Bengal police were pursuing a truck carrying potatoes when it apparently lost its balance at the Odisha border near Lailanpur. All of the potatoes were then returned to West Bengal.

"The market does not carry potatoes. It costs between Rs 70 and Rs 80 per kg at some stores. "There are serious issues facing the middle class and the poor," a Lailanpur customer stated.

Up to three lorries from Uttar Pradesh and one from West Bengal made their way to Bhubaneswar today. On the other hand, Odisha needs over 5,000 tons of potatoes every day. The potatoes that are kept in cold storage will barely last three days, according to reports.

Odisha Byabasai Mahasangha, however, was optimistic that the State's potato problem will be settled in a few days. To assess the situation, supply inspectors have been to a number of markets in Bhograi, which is close to the West Bengal border.

Attempts are underway to acquire potatoes. The problem should be resolved in a few days, according to Odisha Byabasai Mahasangha Secretary Sudhakara Panda, who also stated that the government is attempting to purchase potatoes through NAFED.

The government was criticized by the opposition BJD for the state's ongoing potato crisis.

BJD leader Arun Sahoo stated that rather than making remarks, the administration had to attempt to resolve the state's potato problem.

Krushna Chandra Patra, the minister of food supplies and consumer welfare for Odisha, responded by stating that the state's potato crisis would be rectified shortly.

"The State has received a shipment of potatoes today. Tomorrow, more potatoes will arrive. We are optimistic that a solution to the situation will be found quickly. For the welfare of the public, we would import potatoes from West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh," Minister Patra stated.

BABUS BEGIN TO RESIGN AS THE ODISHA CMO REQUESTS DATA ON OFFICER REENGAGEMENT.



Bureaucrats are resigning in fear as the new BJP government in Odisha plans to reform the "officer raj" system and requests a list of former officials who have been reengaged.

The "officer raj" system, which was a topic of contention during the previous BJD government in the state, is expected to undergo a significant overhaul under the incoming BJP government in Odisha.

After retiring, a number of babus were awarded reengagements during the previous administration.

A list of people who have been reengaged in various departments has now been requested by the Chief Minister's Office (CMO). The departments are furious about the new rule since it requires them to provide data within three days.

Officers who received rehabilitation under the previous BJD administration are concerned about the change.

According to the Congress, officers who have been granted a reextension must be removed. BJD explained that since everything was carried out in an open manner, no one was receiving rehabilitation.

Because there existed officer raj and it was solely for political management, the BJD brought retired babus during its tenure, disregarding young people without jobs and acting in accordance with their wishes. Congress MLA Sagar Das stated that gathering information is insufficient and that action must be taken.

"There are officers whose expertise is required in departments," stated Sarada Jena, a BJD MLA. Only officers who could perform their responsibilities effectively were reengaged throughout BJD's tenure.

According to BJP MLA Amar Nayak, "such officers were given new salaries, pensions, quarters, and vehicles after they retired." As a result, a study and analysis are being conducted in order to expedite the process of hiring new officers.

The entire Odisha power corridor is buzzing right now. Additionally, a few of the babus have begun to submit their papers independently.

The Housing and Urban Development Department has already seen the resignation of two senior executives. IAS (promotion) Sangramjit Nayak, who had been the department's director for the preceding eleven years, got his term extended by the previous BJD government by one year, until June. The director of the Urban Development department, Sarada Panda, was another executive who hoped for a reextension.

After retiring from the state, a number of IAS and OAS personnel reportedly received rehabilitation as well. OTV obtained the list of officials whose terms were extended by the previous BJD by six months to a year.

The Odisha government can revoke such an extension in a single cabinet meeting, according to veteran bureaucrats.

"It is necessary to remove such officers," stated former chief secretary Sahadev Sahoo. It is a positive step if the government has made such a decision.

Following the establishment of the new Odisha government, a number of officials resigned, including IT Secretary Manoj Mishra, previous Chief Minister's advisor R Balakrishnan, and Secretary Suresh Mohapatra. Some others, though, are still holding their positions and are hoping to be reengaged.

THE FIRST SUPERMOON OF 2024 WILL APPEAR IN INDIAN SKIES ON MONDAY NIGHT.



According to NASA, a full, blue supermoon will be visible in the sky on Monday, providing Indian stargazers with a celestial show. For travelers traveling east from Nepal across Asia, including India and Australia, the event's peak will take place on Tuesday morning. According to NASA, a full, blue supermoon will appear in the sky on Monday, providing Indian stargazers with a celestial treat.

The Moon will be full from Sunday morning until early Wednesday morning, according to NASA, with its zenith for travelers traveling east from Nepal to Asia, including India and Australia, on Tuesday morning.

During the evening of August 19 and into the early hours of August 20, India will be able to observe the celestial spectacle, which is one of four successive supermoons this year.

Astrologer Richard Nolle first used the word "supermoon" in 1979 to describe a new or full Moon that happens when the Moon is within 90% of its closest approach to Earth. The largest and brightest full moons of the year are known as full supermoons. Being the third full moon in a season with four full moons, this one is also known as a Blue Moon.

The term "Blue Moon" was coined in 1528, but it won't appear blue. There are a number of theories as to its origins, such as an old English phrase that means "betrayal Moon" or a reference to infrequent atmospheric conditions that give the Moon a blue appearance.

Because large fish are easy to catch during this time of year, the Algonquin tribes have historically referred to the August full moon as the Sturgeon Moon. The Red Moon, Corn Moon, Barley Moon, and Herb Moon are some other names for this moon.

Fans of science fiction will recognize this Sturgeon Moon as a tribute to Theodore Sturgeon, who wrote Star Trek. The Harvest Moon, another name for the next supermoon, will fall on September 17, 2024.

As part of it moves into Earth's shadow at night, it will likewise be partially overshadowed by Earth.

On October 17, there will be the year's third full moon. It will also be the year's closest full moon, also known as Hunter's Moon. On November 15, the year's final supermoon will take place.

THE CENTER ORDERS THE INSURANCE COMPANY TO COMPENSATE 2 LAKH FARMERS FOR CROP LOSS IN THE AMOUNT OF RS 225 CR.

Under the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana, the Center's Technical Advisory Committee has ordered an insurance company to reimburse about 2 lakh farmers in Maharashtra for soybean crop losses of Rs 225 crore.

An insurance company was ordered by the Center's Technical Advisory Committee on Saturday to pay Rs 225 crore in claims that farmers in Maharashtra had filed under the PM's crop insurance program for damage to their soybean crops within a week.

The Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare said in a statement that the move is anticipated to help about 2 lakh farmers. The farmers had been left in the dark by the insurance company's procrastination.

When Union Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan met with farmers in Nanded, Maharashtra, on August 21, the matter gained attention. The issue of unresolved insurance claims for their soy crop was brought up by the Parbhani district farmers to the Union Minister during the meeting.

The Agriculture and Farmers Welfare officials were then instructed by Chouhan to address the matter right away.

In this context, the National Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) met on August 22 at the Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare. During the meeting, the TAC ordered the insurance company to pay the outstanding claims after rejecting the company's opposition to crop cutting experiments.

This ruling requires the payment of outstanding claims totaling between Rs 200 and Rs 225 crore.

A governmentsponsored crop insurance program called the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) seeks to assist the agricultural industry by offering farmers reasonably priced insurance. The program, which was introduced in 2016, provides complete risk coverage for crops against unavoidable natural hazards from the presowing to the postharvest stages.

The program's goal is to give farmers financial assistance when unanticipated circumstances result in crop loss or damage.

Farmers, banks, CSCs, insurance firms, and the federal and state governments are among the many stakeholders that the program unifies on a single platform.



UN ON ATTACKS ON HINDUS IN BANGLADESH: "WE OPPOSE 'RACIALLY MOTIVATED ATTACKS, INCITEMENT TO VIOLENCE'

SecretaryGeneral Antonio Guterres opposes attacks or incitement to violence based on race, according to UN spokesperson Farhan Haq, in response to violence against the Hindu population in Bangladesh. Since former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina fled to India, the violence has intensified.

A representative for UN SecretaryGeneral Antonio Guterres stated that he opposes any attacks or incitement to violence based on race in the context of violence against Bangladesh's minority Hindu community.

We have stated unequivocally that we wish to ensure that the violence that has been taking place in Bangladesh in recent weeks is contained. Farhan Haq, the SecretaryGeneral's deputy spokesperson, stated here on Thursday that "we certainly oppose any racially motivated attacks or incitement to violence."

He was answering a query about the SecretaryGeneral's response to assaults on Bangladesh's minorities, including Hindus.

Since Monday, when former Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina resigned and fled to India, the violence has resulted in the destruction of numerous Hindu temples, homes, and businesses, as well as the deaths of at least two Hindu figures connected to Hasina's Awami League party.

Numerous incidents of violence against minorities have been reported in Bangladeshi media since Hasina left the country. One such instance was the widespread vandalism and destruction at the home of Rahul Ananda, the frontman of the wellknown folk band Joler Gaan, on Monday, which forced the singer and his family to flee.

But the targets are not limited to Hindus. Following the overthrow of the Hasina government on Monday, violence broke out throughout Bangladesh, killing at least 232 people. Since the antiquota protests began in midJuly, 560 people have died.

Haq mentioned the UN's aspirations "for an inclusive process of forming a government" in response to Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus taking the oath of office as chairman of the interim administration.
